The School Admissions Code (2021) states that: "The [Fair Access] Protocol must be consulted upon and developed in partnership with all schools in its area. Once the Protocol has been agreed by the majority of schools in its area, all admission authorities must participate in it." The local authority is therefore keen to raise awareness of the Protocol and how it works, enabling potentially interested parties, as well
